

## **Roberto Aliboni (Italy)**

Roberto Aliboni is Vice-President at the International Affairs Institute-IAI in Rome and head of the Institute's programme on the Mediterranean and the Middle East. He taught International Economics at the Universities of Naples and Perugia from 1972 to 1979 and has held research positions in various institutes. In 1994, he conceived and successfully established the Mediterranean Study Commission (MeSCo), a network of Mediterranean institutes dealing with international and security affairs (which in 1996 was transformed into the Euro-Mediterranean Study Commission -EuroMeSCo).

Presently he is a member of the Steering Committee of EuroMeSCo, the Scientific Council of the Tampere Peace Research Institute-TAPRI, and the Governing Board of the European Union-Israel Forum. He has published numerous articles and books including: *Promoting Democracy in the EMP.
