This workshop, designed by John L. Esposito, Fabio Petito and Armando Salvatore, will host a political dialogue between key actors of an Islamic democratic tradition and European and Western leaders who are interested in a critical engagement with the new realities of Islamic politics and its numerous facets. The idea of this workshop comes from the assumption that Europe has not given enough attention to the role that emerging democratic streams of Islamic political thought and practice, i.e., *Muslim Democrats*, could play in the democratization of the countries of the Eastern and Southern Mediterranean region. In implementing the MEIAD program's goal of bringing together leading intellectuals and policy-makers from Europe and the Muslim world as "actors in dialogue", Giving Voice to Muslim Democrats will contribute to mutual understanding and reduce misperceptions while creating the conditions for a political dialogue among Southern and Northern Mediterranean leaders, between Europe and the Arab world and more generally, between the Islamic world and the West.
